Projects fail if the problem isn't understood fully, or the solution can't fix it. Systems Thinking recognises that the world is made up of interconnected, hierarchically organised, technical, social and natural entities; which often produce behaviours that cannot be predicted by analysing the behaviours of their parts or their sum, individually and separately. As major projects continue to hit the headlines with stories of delays and cost overruns, systems thinking is being seen more and more often as part of the answer.

'Systems Thinking is a discipline for seeing wholes rather than parts, for seeing patterns of change rather than static snapshots, and for understanding the subtle inter-connectedness that gives (living) systems their unique character'. Peter Senge in "The Fifth Discipline: The Art & Practice of The Learning Organization"

The APM Systems Thinking SIG is the youngest of the APM's SIGs and aims to share the value of the holistic systems thinking mindset and toolset in understanding the business problem and how well a proposed solution will solve it. Systems thinking helps quickly explore and understand the scope, interfaces and dynamics of the problem, the solution to be delivered and the impact of the project on business as usual.

This understanding aids in setting up projects that have a good chance of success, through solving the real problem with a quality i.e. fit-for-purpose, solution without the seemingly inevitable "Phase 2". To this end, we use systems thinking techniques in all our events, to illustrate how easy they are to understand and how quick they are to use.

Our current programme includes:

- A multi-SIG conference on improving project success through focusing on the future
- A webinar on justifying changes, including cancellation, to projects and programmes that are heading for failure
- A series of guides, the first of which is on "Using Systems Thinking to Select the Right Projects".
